

TARGET POPULATION

Pregnant and parenting women are an underserved, at-risk segment of the substance-using population. Hannah's House serves the following individuals with SUDs:

- a. Pregnant women;
- b. Women with dependent children;
- c. Women attempting to regain custody of their children;
- d. Postpartum women and their children; or
- e. Women with substance exposed infants.

(1) The target population defined above is herein after referred to as pregnant and parenting women.

ADMISSION PRIORITY

Among women with SUDs, pregnant women require more urgent treatment services and critical, high-risk prenatal care due to the harmful effects of drug use on the fetus. Hannah's House shall provide preference to pregnant women.

a. Specifically, priority admission to treatment in the following order:

- (1) Pregnant injection drug users;
- 2) Pregnant substance users;
- (3) Injection drug users; and
- (4) All others.

Useful Information

Alcohol and other drug use can play a significant role in the spread of HIV:

- Injection drug use is one of the causes of HIV and is responsible for approximately 10% of HIV cases annually.
- If you inject drugs, you can get HIV from needle sharing drug preparation or injecting equipment ("works") with a person who has HIV. You can also then pass HIV to your sex and drug using partners.

HIV-infected blood can also get into drug solutions by:

- Using blood-contaminated syringes to prepare drugs, reusing water, reusing bottle caps, spoons, or other containers to dissolve drugs into water and to heat drug solutions, reusing small pieces of cotton or cigarette filters to filter out particles that could block the needle.

People who are at greater risk for contracting TB include:

- People with HIV infection, people who became infected with TB bacteria, babies and young children, elderly

Steps to reduce HIV:

- Get tested & know your partners status
- Have protected sex (use condoms) and get tested & treated for STD's
- Do not inject Drugs
